
HELPFUL HINTS FOR DOING BIOACOUSTIC WORK

It takes a lot of courage and due diligence to juggle learning a new technology with creating a marketing strategy for your new vocation at the same time. After the 2-day BioAcoustic Technician workshop, many of you contacted us to say what now? Many of you wanted desperately to take the professional 5-day Seminar.

We have listed a few suggestions for either 2 or 5 day Participants that may help kick-start your new career after you have mastered the software and can make BioAcoustic Reports with ease.

- 1. Be sure you have a working knowledge of BioAcoustics by reading the basic articles that were shared with you: The Potential of Math as Medicine; Is Frequency our new Medicine or an Ancient Mystery Revealed; The Robin Williams Case; Breaking the Sound Barriers of Disease...
- 2. Notify your community that you have taken the 2-day BioAcoustic Workshop and that you have software that can BioAcoustically evaluate muscle strengths and weaknesses...; define nutritional status and general evaluate wellness status based on the frequencies of the voice.

One of the best ways to accomplish this is to research local radio shows/hosts that may be interested in Alternative Modalities of Health & Healing. To do this start with a computer search using the name of you city/or zip code and radio. Likely what will come up is www.radio-locator.com. This will show the radio stations that are geographically located near you.

Each radio station has a website that you can use to search for compatible shows. Notify our office with the show names plus contact information and we will attempt to set up a radio show with us online and you in the local studio; identifying you as the local BioAcoustic Provider.

3. Locate your local alternative wellness providers. Propose that you work with their clients to provide additional information and become a staff member to provide BioAcoustic Services. There are several online resources/directories:

4. Create an introductory letter or flyer about your services. Provide them with any or all of the articles you have or use one of the videos made available to you: Good Vibration, Breaking the Sound Barriers of Disease or Miracles of nonMedicine.

Remember to make no claims, BioAcoustics is a research modality. Show what you can provide; take proof. Don't expect anyone to accept your word.



Visit your Local gym or exercise club – Demonstrate or show what you can do as an identifier of muscles issues. We have articles dealing with Tiger Woods golf swing, the rehabilitation of stroke and accident victims. Many of these are located on our web site or the office may have copies of articles that deal with muscle and rehabilitation.

Contact the owner and ask if you can collect data as part of a BioAcoustic Project. Ask each person what muscle they are working on – then show them what is really needed. Remember when you talk with them, show the report – what muscle shows up the most – show potential problem issues – too high may be injury – need to support weak. Word will spread about how accurate and helpful your information is.

- 5. Local sports teams or schools may also be interested Help keep players off the bench use the Predictive Section of the Muscles Management software to show the potential for injuries that could be prevented.
- 6. Local health food stores are often good locations to demonstrate what you can reveal about a person. You may need to volunteer at first but once you can show the owner how you can help educate consumers to purchase with more correct information about their health. Maybe rent a table or booth at your local mall. Put up flyers the week before
- 7. Keep track of local alternative health/healing workshops, expos, etc. Suggest that you be included as a speaker or just rent a booth. When the organizers find out how accurate you are, they will include you in any future programs. This provides opportunities for clients.
- 8. Organize your own BioAcoustic Classes. Your local church or special interest group may be interested. Let them know that Sound Health is a federally registered 501(c)3 non-profit. A speech or demonstration at your local library may also be a possibility. We will help you online at first until you can teach on your own. This is you \$\$ to keep; we can provide public versions of software for your students.
- 9. Frequency asked questions (FAQ) can give you more ideas about how to raise money to attend the advanced classes. Located under our CLASSES link on our website, it is a stockpile of information that will help you support your BioAcoustic practice.
- 10. PayPal may lend you the money to take the advanced classes especially when you let them know that you will be paying for equipment to set up a new business.
- 11. Your local Community Services organization may have funds to help retrain you or even your local church may pool their funds to send you to the advanced classes.

Initially we provided free classes, free software and support so that you can begin your BioAcoustic career with very little cash outlay. It is an incredible way to serve your community and at the same time provide income for you and your family.
